Officer Avrech submitted an overtime slip for late reports that I feel is unjustified. Four reports were submitted for approval. They were taken between 0930/1200 and were all sloppy and incomplete.

1.) 487.1 11-10: This should have been a hold pending report for an extensive jewelry loss from Oct. 84. There was no information as to how the crime occurred and MO suggests a 459 ("tool" is key; point of entry and type of lock are circled.) When I asked him if anyone was staying in the house while the RP was out of town, he replied, "Who cares? The guy just needs an insurance report. He gave the keys to a pest control place." I then told him to add that info to the report under "additional information". Again he argued that he felt it was unnecessary. When he finally did include the info, he said he hadn't bothered to ask who the company was because nobody cared.

2.) Lost Property: Failed to list what property was lost. When he added "passport" he didn't know the country of origin or the number because "nobody cares." Again his reasoning was that the guy just needs a police report to obtain a duplicate.

3.) 459 C/P: This should have been a 487.1. There were no signs of forced entry and most of the boxes weren't filled in.

4.) 481: The report says that P1 looked in his rearview mirror and then fled the scene. The investigators report doesn't list any suspects. When asked, Avrech said it was dark so P2 couldn't see who was in the car or how many people. I pointed out that he checked daylight. I also advised him that for report purposes, "division" meant "front counter", not E-2. Again he started arguing and said, "I'm assigned to Eastern!" He was totally unable to handle the

volume of inquiries received at the front counter during the first watch! He asked if he could call a unit out of the field to help him with the 11-10's. I told him no, but that if he needed help, he could ask TRU to send someone over. NEVER STATED
